



GUIDELINES FOR AUTHORS

1. The author(s) should ensure originality of the article and ensure that the submitted manuscript has not been published previously and is not under consideration for publication elsewhere. A cover letter should clearly identify the author's name (with designation, address, phone, fax, e-mail address) responsible for correspondence.
2. Two hard copies along with a soft copy through email (editorboujard@gmail.com) should be submitted, typed in English (Times New Roman; 11 Font). Margin should be well defined (Left 2.00, Right 1.00, Top 1.50 and down 1.00 inches), in A-4 size paper. Pages should numbered chronologically. The article should not **exceed 15 journal pages** including tables, figures and/or references.
3. Contents should be ordered as follows: Title page, Abstract with Keywords, Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results, Discussion, Conclusion, Acknowledgement (if applicable), References. Table and Figures with caption.
4. **Title page:** This should include the title of the article, authors' names and affiliations, complete mailing address, e-mail and telephone number of one of the authors who will revise the proof and suggest running title.
5. **Abstract:** This should be in the 2nd page of the manuscript. Title should also be written on the top of the abstract. The abstract should consist of not more than 150 words.
6. **Keywords:** A list of 3-6 keywords to be provided directly below the abstract. Keywords should reflect the precise content of the manuscript and of words or phrases.
7. **Body of the manuscript:** see the section (b).
8. **Acknowledgement (If applicable):** All acknowledgements including those for grant and financial support should be typed in one separate paragraph that directly precedes the reference section.
9. **References**

Literature cited are identified in the text for single author as (Sardar, 2003), for double author (Sardar and Sarker, 2003) and for multi-author citation as (Sardar *et al.*, 2003). For multiple papers of the same author(s) published in the same year should be cited as (Sardar, 2003a), (Sardar, 2003b) or (Sardar *et al.*, 2003a) or (Sardar *et al.*, 2003b) etc. All Citations in the text should be typed double-spaced in a separate section at the end of the paper and arranged in alphabetic order. Abbreviations should conform to those in *Index Medicus*. Citation may be listed as follows :

Tables

Tables should be typed on different sheets, and numbered consecutively. Tables should be self-explanatory including a brief descriptive title.

Illustrations/Figures/Photographs: Illustrations should be drawn or with computer and be in a form ready for plating. A brief legend should be provided for every diagram and photograph on a separate sheet of paper and should not be incorporated in the figure. The illustrations should be numbered on the back with a pencil. The place of inclusions of the figures in the text should be clearly indicated. Figures should be numbered in the order in which they are mentioned in the text. Photographs should be clear, black and white on glossy print.

Number of tables, illustrations and photographs should be kept at absolute minimum. Same results should not be presented both in tables and figures.

Short Communications: Short Communications should contain short description of objective of the work, materials and methods and results and discussion without any headings. Literature cited will be included under the respective heading. Short communications are concise manuscripts of two or less journal pages i.e. about 3-5 pages of A4 size paper including Tables and Figures.

10. All measurements must be given in metric units.
11. Authors will receive galley proofs, which they are requested to correct and return as soon as possible. New matter should not be inserted in the text at the time of proof reading.
12. No paper will be accepted for publication if it is not prepared following the style specified for the journal. Recent issues of the journal may be consulted for style.
13. Author's Copy: Ten copies of reprint will be supplied free of charge along one copy of issue.
14. The Author(s) must submit a copyright form and authorization in favor of BOU to the editor.
15. Disclaimer: No paper will be accepted for publication if it does not conform to the style specified for the Journal.
16. Authorship: Maximum 4 (four) authors may jointly submit the manuscript for a single article. Incase of science and experimental empirical research based article(s) 5 (five) authors may be allowed.
17. Manuscripts should be sent to Editor.
